CLUB DEPORTIVO SHARES

Report from Club Deportivo's Charitable Giving Committee Club Deportivo believes in charity. This tradition was established by the second item in the Club's MISSION statement, as included in the original Charter. There are two funds in the Club treasury that provide support to the local Kino community, and many dedicated people work hard to raise this money. The first pot of money is referred to as the Board Allocated Fund. Ten percent of your membership dues go to this fund, and it is used to help those in need of medical, nutritional, educational, safety, youth development, and elderly assistance. Anyone asking to receive these funds must go to the Club office and fill out a request form detailing the need. The Charitable Giving committee, with the assistance of the Club management, then reviews, investigates, and make decisions about these requests. This past fiscal year (October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024) our budget was \$65,382 pesos. We purchased a supply of diapers, food for the soup kitchen, 2 oxygen tanks, oxygen regulators, and an oxygen concentrator. We also helped the Red Cross with supply needs, and at least 6 families/groups with medical equipment, medications, treatments, supplies, and food. We anticipate about 75,168 pesos available for this current fiscal year (October 1, 2024 - September 30, 2025. We have allocated 10,800 thus far to assist local people with medical expenses. (Sometimes a small amount can make a big difference in our local community!)

The second fund is the Charity Fund. This is made up mostly of money generated through the Annual Benefit Dinner/Auction/Raffle and other fund-raising events conducted by the Club and its members. We also receive donations from individual people.

The Benefit Dinner has been an annual event since 2012. Funds raised are awarded to various groups in the Kino community, including the schools, Red Cross, and other social programs. Groups receiving donations must go through an application process, and once approved, are assigned tasks to help hold the event. How your contributions are used.

The Benefit Dinner of 2024 was another successful event. This dinner raised \$352,638 MXN pesos for the Charity Fund. Right off the top, 40% went to Club Deportivo. We well know that the Club must remain financially healthy in order to be able to give aid to the local community.

Even then, our pool of money in the Charity Fund to donate was quite large. We had 23 applications, and 211,583 pesos were available for allocation. We also have some reserve funds from previous dinners (\$63,023 pesos). We do keep 50,000 of this in reserve for potential emergencies.

The table on the right shows the proceeds and allocations of 2024 charitable fund-raising activities, plus the Emergency Reserves from previous years.

The committee feels strongly that donated funds must be used wisely and responsibly. Therefore, we monitor how benefitting groups use our donations, including requiring receipts for goods and services purchased with our donated funds. Requests are researched as best as possible. So, each group does not necessarily receive the same amount of money. We try to make sure that any available alternative funding (government programs, community resources. etc.) is used before we allocate money, so not all requests are approved.

There are many needs in this community. We strive to address these as best as possible. The next benefit dinner/fundraiser is scheduled for March 15, 2025!!

Hard to believe that it is 2025, but time marches on

12/23/24 NIGHTWINGS fished the beach near north of Dos Palmas for Cortez Halibut, a few Rockies and one Sierra. Used Kastmaster spoons in chrome or chrome and blue, 3/4 to 1 ounce. There may have been more Sierra around because I was cut off twice after hard bites on chrome spoons.

12/30/254 CAMINO DEL MAR fished Dead Man for big Yellowtail, trolling with X-Raps in "Bunker" and "White Ghost". Also caught Salmon, Goldies, Sheephead, and spear-fished near Red Rock for lobster and Trigger Fish. KAYAK JACK fished off the shore near Red Rock Beach and Point for Halibut and Mojarra. DRIFTWOOD fished the "Cross Roads" for a catch including Yellowtail and Grouper and Goldies near Turner. NIGHTWINGS fished from the beach North of Dos Palmas for a couple of Halibut using Striped Bass jigs near the bottom.

12/31/24 EL SUENO fished the Turner'Dead Man area for Yellowtail and "Cabrilla". Water temperatures were around 59 degrees Fahrenheit. Silver and Striped Mackerel X-Raps were working best.

01/09/25 EL SUENO again fished the Dead Man-Turner area for Yellowtail with X-Rap in (Blue?) Mackerel and "Silver Ghost".

01/18/25 EL SUENO trolled X-Raps in Mackerel and Silver for nice Yellowtail in 58-59 degree water and Goldies on the bottom until the winds came up.

General Information: Before we left Kino around 01/15, the mornings were starting out very calm but the winds were coming up strongly by noon, making the seas very choppy. Keep an eye on the wind forecasts and winds and have your life jackets (PFD) handy and your radio with you, especially if in smaller craft.
