Report from Club Deportivo's Charitable Giving Committee

Club Deportivo believes in charity. This tradition was established by the second item in the Club's MISSION statement, as included in the original Charter.

The Benefit Dinner has been an annual event since 2012. Funds raised are awarded to various groups in the Kino community, including the schools, Red Cross, and other social programs. Groups receiving donations must go through an application process, and once approved, are assigned tasks to help hold the event. This year we had 25 applicants.

The Benefit Dinner of 2025 was another successful event. This dinner raised \$350,000 MXN pesos for the Charity Fund. The Festival of Trees was a charity event that occurred in December 2024 and raised an additional \$50,000 MXN pesos. Right off the top, 40% of this money went to Club Deportivo. We know that the Club must remain financially healthy in order to be able to give aid to the local community. The Club receives \$160,000 MXN pesos, and the charitable giving fund receives \$240,000 MXN pesos. This is all thanks to the tremendous efforts of the organizers and volunteers from both these events.

The committee feels strongly that donated funds must be used wisely and responsibly. Therefore, we monitor how benefitting groups use our donations, including requiring receipts for goods and services purchased with our donated funds. Requests are researched as best as possible. So, each group does not necessarily receive the same amount of money. We try to make sure that any available alternative funding (government programs, community resources. etc.) is used before we allocate money, so not all requests are approved.

There are many needs in this community. We strive to address these as best as possible.

Thank you for your continued commitment to Club Deportivo and its important role in our Kino Community. The Charitable Giving Committee welcomes your questions and suggestions.

The last several months have been relatively uneventful for Rescue One. The staff has done a great job of doing the radio operations. In the Month of February 54 boats reported going out with 191 persons aboard. There were no requests for assistance. It is getting into warmer weather, and we should anticipate an increase in the number of fishing and recreational boaters. The roads, beaches and ramps will become more crowded as warm weather and summer approach. Easter week is almost always one of the most crowded times of the year. The boat launch ramp is usually closed for those days. When making plans it would be wise to plan accordingly. Holiday crowds and increased traffic congestion make any emergency much more complicated and difficult. During holidays and busy weekends try and plan ahead to eliminate unnecessary driving if possible.

Rescue One has been fortunate to find and add two very qualified experienced people to our first responder list. There are certain days and holidays the Club Deportivo staff does not work. Rescue One radio still provides a radio operator on "channel #26" those days. We would like to find more volunteers who might be available and interested in helping to occasionally man the radio on Staff holidays, anyone interested please contact Rebeca at Club Deportivo. 662-356-1737.

FISHING NEWS

Reporting Period:

February 26 TO MARCH 23, 2025

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

02/27/25 CAPTAIN JACK fished Island Turner for Goldies.

03/01/25 AL LE LU HIA (sorry about the spelling) caught limits of Yellowtail at Turner. **MOBILE FLUX** also caught Yellowtails at Turner and **HILLBILLY YACHT** was fishing south of Deep Reef and landed Grouper and nice Goldies. **NIGHTWINGS** had a great day jigging with Salas and Tady heavy jigs near the birds east of the Turner reef, along with most of rest of the fleet. There were at least ten boats fishing under the birds in the mid morning hours, but these were the only reports I received. We saw water temperatures approaching a couple 68 degrees east of Turner.

03/02/25 RENEGADE trolled “diving plugs” at Turner under big time bird action and caught good Yellowtail. Then they landed Goldies on the south reef at Turner on Diamond jigs.

03/05/25 CAPTAIN JACK, trolled near Turner for Yellowtail and added Grouper and Goldies in deeper water. The grouper was a Rosie Baqueta/Cony and was caught by Larry’s, son, Jake on his first Kino trip. Great Job!

FISHING NEWS

03/10/25 CAPTAIN JACK caught Sand Bass off the KBE and Red Rock beaches in his inflatable in 35 to 40 feet of water.

03/11/25 SAND DOLLAR went north up to and past Eagle's Nest for Goldies and a nice Grouper.

03/14/25 EL SUENO fished from Turner up to Eagles' Nest and caught Yellowtail trolling Rapala 30 look-a-likes in the Mackerel patter and "assorted cabrilla". He reported 57-to-58-degree water.

03/17/25 WET WILLY fished north near Battle Ship Rock for Goldies on the bottom, then ran into birds diving near Eagle's Nest and trolled for limits of Yellowtail. **RIDGE RUNNER** fished from Eagle's Nest out towards the channel to the west for Yellowtail, Goldies, and Mother-in Laws (AKA Suegra or Giant Gobies). **SAND DOLLAR** was at Eagle Nest and north for Goldies and Salmon (Pacific White Fish). **EL SUENO** trolled for Yellowtail using X-Rap 30 Mackerels. He reported water temperatures between 57 and 58 degrees. **DOS PRIMOS** caught Yellowtail and Goldies in the Turner area. **NIGHTWINGS** drifted over large areas from Turner north to Punto Colorado Risco and caught Goldies, Sandies, and Mother-in-Law.

03/22/25 SAND DOLLAR caught Goldies on the bottom near and north of Turner but saw no sign of Yellowtail. **RENEGADE** tried trolling but saw no Yellowtail action, then bottom fished at Colorado Risco and the Crossroads for Goldies and Grouper. Water temperature was down to 55 degrees.
